Background

- 2010: Directive 2010/63/EU on the protection of animals used for scientific purposes
- 18 december 2014: Directive implemented in the Dutch revised Animal Procedures Act (Wod)
- Because of this Wod, establishment of:
 - National Committee for the protection of animals used for scientific purposes (Ncad)
 - > Central Authority for Scientific Procedures on Animals (CCD)





NCad

- Advisory body, established by the Ministry of Economic Affairs
- No hierarchical position compared to CCD, DECs, Animal welfare bodies or establishements performing animal experiments
- Independent and impartial
- Contribute to minimalisation of animal use in experiments by advise, exchange of knowledge and (inter)national networks



Legal tasks NCad

- Advise Minister Economic Affairs, CCD, Animal welfare bodies and others about purchase, breeding, housing, care, and use of animals in experimenta and alternatives.
- Spread best practices
- Exchange of information with NC's of other member states
- Stimulate development, validation, acceptance and use of alternatives (both national and international)
- Support communication with and between professionals and inform the public about animal experiments and alternatives



Animal welfare body (Awb) legal tasks

- Advises performers of animal experiments on animal welfare concerning purchase, housing, care and use
- Advises performers of animal experiments on 3 Rs and informs on technical and scientific developments
- Establishes and controls internal procedures to secure welfare of animals in the institution
- Advises on continuation of projects, based on the results of the project
- Advises on adoption of animals



Animal Experiments Committee (DEC)

• Advises the Central Authority for Scientific Procedures on Animals on project licence applications



Central Authority for Scientific Procedures on Animals

- Independent governing body (ZBO)
- 5 members + Secretary
- Distant from the licence holders / centralised
- The only body for project licencing
- Recognises/recalls Animal Experiments Committees
- Delivers guidelines for DEC advise
- NTS will be published on the website of the CCD



Animals that are protected by the Wod


- a) Live non-human vertebrate animals, including:
- i) Independently feeding larval forms; and
- ii) foetal forms of mammals as from the last third of their normal development
- b) Live cephalopods



When do you need a licence? Definition of a procedure:

any use, invasive or non-invasive, of an animal for experimental or other scientific purposes, with known or unknown outcome, or educational purposes, which **may cause** the animal a level of pain, suffering, distress or lasting harm equivalent to, or higher than, that caused by **the introduction of a needle** in accordance with good veterinary practice.

This includes any course of action intended, or liable, to result in the birth or hatching of an animal or the creation and maintenance of a genetically modified animal line in any such condition, including the killing of animals **solely for the use of their organs or tissues**;

Types of applications

- Project licence application: new project
- Amendment: when the project alterations will adversely affect the welfare of the animals or affect the basic principles of the project licence
- Notification*: when the proposed alternations do not adversely affect the welfare of the animals it is sufficient to notify the CCD


Application for a project licence

- Non technical summary (in Dutch)
- Project licence application for animal procedures (in Dutch)
- Project proposal
- Appendix Description animal procedures
- Optional:
 - > Form 'melding machtiging' (in Dutch)
 - > DEC advice


Route 1: Apply directly to the CCD



* Max. 40 days, possibility to be extended with 15 days.



Route 2: Apply with a DEC advice included



* Max. 40 days, possibility to be extended with 15 days.




Path for project application

- Application complete, signed, and paid for
- Total time from receiving application to decision CCD is max. 40 working days
- This deadline can be extended with max. 15 working days
- When extra information is requested from the applicant the clock will be temporarily stopped. The process will continue when the required information is received by the CCD
- In certain cases there is an option for urgency



Path for project application





One needs to apply for a project licence at the CCD before one is allowed to perform any study or project which involves the use of laboratory animals (Wod art. 10a)

The CCD only approves an application when:

•The purpose of the project is relevant from a scientific or educational viewpoint, or is legally required;

•The objective(s) of the project justify the use of animals;

•The project is designed in a way that makes the animal experiments as humane as possible.

•Most important part of the Dutch legislation: No, unless...



From procedure to project level

Project: a programme of work with a well-defined goal which entails one or more animal procedures*

- > Animal experiments with a logical coherence
- > Serving a common, well-defined purpose
- > The sub-goals each contribute to the main purpose
- Impact for each animal is clear
- Feasible to achieve this purpose within the autorisation period of max. 5 years

Projectevaluation by CCD includes especially

- Evaluation of the goals and expected results or educational value
- Information on the positioning of the research
- Evaluation of assigned severity classifications
- Harm-benefit analysis: is the harm to the animals (suffering, pain, distress) justified by the expected outcome? (Ethical considerations
- Evaluation of feasability (realistic goals, animal model)
- 3 R's
- Animals bred but not used "in voorraad gedood"
- Advice of DEC carries great weight



•Special emphasis

- Endangered species
- Non-human primates
- Animals taken from the wild
- Animals not bred for use in procedures (Annex 1)
- Stray and feral animals of domestic species
- Re-use
- No anesthesia/analgesia when applicable
- Method of killing deviating from guideline (Annex 4)



What is the maximum size of a project proposal?

- No maximum number of animals
- No maximum number of animal procedures (appendices)
- Limit complexity
- Goal should be feasible within 5 years
- Steps to take / choices to be made should be clear
- Links and relations between different animal procedures should be clear
- Go / no-go moments and criteria should be clear
- Proposal should be clear without background knowledge



Animal procedures / level of detail

- Clearly describe how you have made certain that you have researched all aspects properly
- Provide a description of i.e. types of pain medication, but not in detail
- What treatments affect animal welfare?
- Experimental design is more important than individual experiments.
- Describe type, frequency and duration of procedures
- Describe read-outs
- Explain choices



3 R's

- In the new legislation there is a lot of emphasis on the 3R's the golden rule is : NO, unless.....
- Therefore it is of great importance to explain:
 - > Why you need to use animals?
 - > What do you do to minimize distress and pain?
 - What is the desicion making process for welfare indicators and optimal housing conditions?



Description Animal procedures at <u>D. Replacement,</u> <u>Reduction, Refinement</u>

- Adress the 3R's on a more "animal model" level:
 - > Why you need to use laboratory animals?
 - > What do you do to minimize distress and pain?
 - What is the desicion making process for welfare indicators and optimal housing conditions?



After evaluation by the CCD

- The applicant receives the decision of the CCD, if positive, including the license.
- Publication of NTS on website CCD
- CCD is a Independent Governing Body, therefore all communication with the CCD can be requested under the Freedom of Information Act (Wob)
- Objection and appeal is possible, but only for people with a clear interest in the matter.



Non Technical Summary

- Is a mandatory part of the project application
- Should be in Dutch (EU requirement)
- Approximately 500 words
- Important to:
- Consider the content carefully
- Ensure the meaning and relevance of the content
- Suitable for a broad audience
- No privacy sensitive information, i.e. names and addresses
- Goal: to provide transparency



Freedom of information act (WOB)

- Stakeholders are asked for their vision
- Strong arguments necessary for refusing
- privacy, company secret, safety
- CCD decides whether or not to reveal information



Objection and appeal

- Objection at CCD
- Appeal at court of justice





Summary

- Animal Welfare Bodies, NCad and CCD
- New role for the Animal Experiments Committees
- Evaluation of animal procedures take place on a different (project) level
- Further information can be requested under the Freedom of Information Act
- Society will be critical on the work we all do
- This requires clear and well defined project proposals and well motivated and carefully considerated descriptions
